Married/civil partner with children	Your household effects plus personal estate up to £30,000.00 will go to your surviving spouse. The remainder will be divided 50 percent to your surviving spouse and 50 percent to your children.	Life enjoyment of the matrimonial home will be given to your surviving spouse. Ownership will be divided equally between your surviving spouse and your children.
